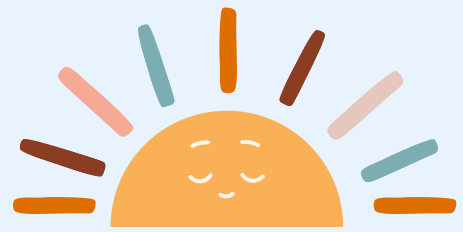

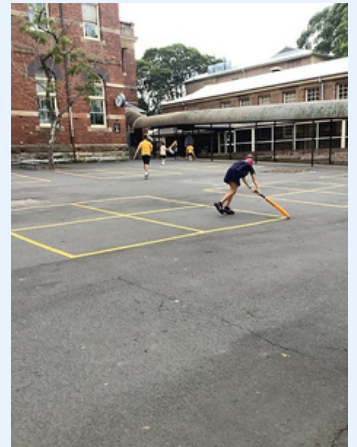


LOOSH Acknowledgement of Country

This month, our program has been all about balance! With so many children enrolled in our service, it is important our activities reflect the interests, skills, and passions of all the children in our service.

As a result, February has been filled with a mix of STEM focused activities, like coding and science experiments, arts and crafts, such as monster painting and copycat fish crafting, gross motor sports, like soccer clinics and archery, and cooking opportunities, such as muffin making and orange juicing. As a result, every child has shown engagement with our program, and some child-led activities have even been incorporated into our program due to popular demand, like cricket and top model clothes designing!

LOOSH is introducing clubs to our programming this year! Each club will run in the same session each week, allowing children to continually build on their skills and learning through a carefully curated program made by our educators.

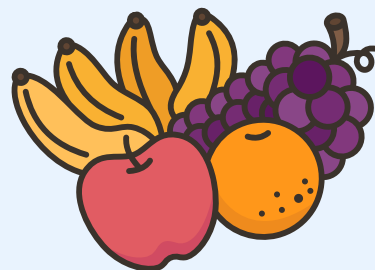
Cooking Club!

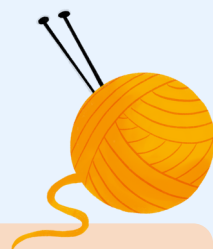
Soccer Club!

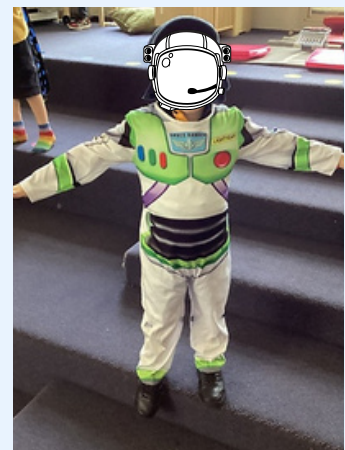
